COVID19 Impact on Employment

- Unemployment increased from 7.2% to 33.8%
- Automation Trends Accelerated
- Hardest Hit Business Sectors
 - Retail, Restaurants, Personal Services, Social Services (>50%)
- 30% to 50% of Businesses at Risk of Failure
- Pre-COVID Highest Paying Sector was Government; Lowest Paying Sectors were Hospitality and Retail
- Work from Home Accelerated
 - 31% of CV Jobs (38% national)

Elon Musk Effect: Outmigration of Talent/Wealth

- Visible Tiff with Governor and Alameda Co. Supervisors
- Divested of all California Real Estate
- Tesla Expansions
 - Gigafactory to Nevada (0% State Income Tax)
 - Truck Factory to Texas (0% State Income Tax)
- Elon's Contract: \$50 Billion Bonus Opportunity
 - Stay in California and pay \$8.4 Billion in taxes
 - Move to Texas and pay \$0 in taxes
