Support increased coordination and collaboration with COD and higher education institutions to align curriculum and programs to workforce needs to support economic development and sustainability in the region.
- ENERGY Support energy technologies that are safe, reliable, and affordable. Encourage carbon reduction efforts, battery storage, lithium extraction, hydrogen, renewable natural gas, clean vehicles, solar, wind, and energy storage.
- JOBS Support diversification of the work force, including remote workers. Support the iHub, to include training and incentives for a diverse work force, including IT and a coding academy. Support internship at all levels.

## **General Updates**

- Planning is underway for Riverside County Innovation Month 2022. CVEP is serving on the Innovation Month planning committee, as well as the Fast Pitch/Events committee.
  - First local planning session with Joaquin Tijerina and Bob Wright held earlier this month.
  - Tentative date for Fast Pitch Greater Palm Springs is April 7 (pending location).
  - Tentative location for Fast Pitch Greater Palm Springs is COD Indio Campus. Working with COD's Jocelyn Vargas, Interim Director of Education Centers, East Valley.
  - Riverside County Fast Pitch Finale is scheduled for April 27 at Temecula City Hall.
- CVEP is included on an RFP response to the California Office of the Small Business Advocate for the California Dream Fund Grant program. The California Black Chamber of Commerce is the primary applicant; CVEP is joining the proposal as an outreach partner for this region. Submitted January 12, 2022.
- Laura James presented yesterday, January 18, at the 2022 One Future Coachella Valley Midyear Summit. The topic of the presentation is Becoming Financially Independent.
- Last month we reported that we'd be presenting to a group of Canadian real estate investors in late January.

  Due to the COVID surge, that group has postponed their trip to the Coachella Valley until further notice.

# CVEP Business Center Operations Operational Highlights December 2021

- 1. The executive committee is working to move toward a listening tour during the first few months of 2022 as part of a CVEP Sustainable Funding plan.
- 2. CVEP served a consultative role in advising the City of Palm Springs Planning Commission on issues related to zoning and lifestyle in changing their height restrictions to attract Amazon and other fulfillment centers. The City Manager estimates the benefit of such a place at \$30M/yr.
- 3. P1CV has negotiated for support of the continued effort to secure funds to expand the CSU Palm Desert Campus. It is abundantly clear that without some outside funding CSU has no plans to physically expand the Palm Desert Campus.
- 4. CVEP and CSUSB's cybersecurity team hosted a day-long meeting with the United States Space Force and the Pacific Northwest Federal Research Lab to discuss expanding the cybersecurity offerings at the Palm Desert iHub to meet the needs for talent.
- 5. CVEP and the City of Palm Desert hosted four members of the CSUSB Board of Trustees and President Morales to discuss expansion of programs at the Palm Desert Campus.
- 6. CVEP provided much needed PPE to the businesses of the Coachella Valley to blunt the spread of the omicron variant. We are low on masks but have plenty of sanitizer.
- 7. CVEP was invited to meet with the Consul General of Canada to discuss commercial opportunities between Canada and the Coachella Valley. The meeting was in Palm Springs.
- 8. Joe Wallace has been appointed to the technology review board of Breakthrough Energy that is a consortium of the Gate's Foundation and others that are funding projects that have the potential to reduce 500 Megatons of CO2 emissions by 2050.
- 9. CVEP has applied for a grant in the amount of \$20,000 from the Inland Empire non-profit consortium.
- 10. CVEP has served as the speaker at the Inland Empire Innovation Ecosystem Conference on the subject of CVEP's role in the innovation ecosystem. We are thought highly of by IEGo, and the UCR Center for Social Innovation.

# **Budget News and Projections:**

Massage Envy has notified CVEP that they cannot financially provide any support for this fiscal year. This brings the revenue losses from sponsorships to \$115,000 in the fiscal year. We are still projecting a positive cash flow fiscal year, but the margin for error is small. Our cash position remains strong, but sustainability is elusive. We are also seeing price increases for nearly everything we buy from office supplies to utilities.
