BUSINESS SERVICES REPORT MAY 17, 2023

Business Services Updates

- Since we last met, CVEP held the following events:

 - May 10: Morning Insights at Palm Desert iHub
- Upcoming events:
 - · June 14: Morning Insights at Palm Desert iHub
 - Date TBD: Business 101
- Kalyse LaForey Stewart is our summer intern from California Baptist University; last week she began work with iHub client company TwinCare. Ms. Stewart will be extensively researching the competitive landscape for TwinCare.

She is also slated to do projects with Hello Computer, Inc. and The Greater Palm Springs Film Alliance, spending approximately 3-4 weeks with each company. Ms. Stewart attended the Riverside County Fast Pitch Finale as our guest to gain an understanding of the kinds of entrepreneurs we work with.

- Laura James represented CVEP at the Innovation Incubator (IN2) Channel Partner Meeting and National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) Industry Growth Forum in Denver, CO from May 1-3. CVEP receives a stipend for attending. Attendance also unlocks the possibility of funding awards for pilot projects in entrepreneurship and innovation in the energy and agtech sector, as well as other, smaller Channel Partner funding awards.
- New Data Digest published: Proportion of the CV Population with Health Insurance.
- CVEP has submitted a proposal to the Desert Healthcare District to conduct an analysis of the following:
 - Quantifying the economic impacts of lack of access to healthcare
 - Analyzing the relationship between lack of access to healthcare and economic growth The project, if it moves forward, is estimated to take up to six months to complete.
- CVEP applied and was approved to become a Google Scholarship partner. CVEP will provide scholarships to Google's Cybersecurity Certificate program, which also includes job placement assistance. More details to come as we design and launch the program to be as equitable and beneficial as possible.



- iHub projects over the last month include:
 - RivCo Fast Pitch Finale practice with Moducan Corporation
 - Orchestrating the Meet the Entrepreneurs events
 - Identifying/coordinating intern projects
 - Interviewed one new iHub applicant: CareVirtue. Admitted to the Palm Springs iHub.
 - Arranged and attended meeting with Hello Computer Inc. and College of the Desert Health Sciences and Education department. Goal: unbiased product feedback from early childhood education experts.
- Community impact projects include: CSUSB Advancement Executive Committee, IEGO, SCE Community Advisory Panel, College of the Desert Computer Information Systems (CIS) Advisory Committee, Palm Desert Chamber of Commerce Lunch Speaker.

CEO REPORT MAY 18, 2023



Operational Highlights April 2023

- IEGO has advised CVEP that the RFP to serve as the sub-convenor for developing the economic development plan for the Coachella Valley and the Morongo Basin should be made available in June. We are poised to respond positively to the solicitation.
- 2. CVEP has participated in the interview process for CSUSB-Palm Desert Campus to replace CVEP Board Member and retiring Dean Jake Zhu. The three candidates were all highly qualified and we are looking forward to working with the new campus leadership.
- CVEP has initiated the disposal of surplus and abandoned equipment. We have a verbal agreement to sell off the surplus capital equipment in Building #12 for \$5,000. The sandbags will be sold on Ebay. The sales will begin in the next couple of weeks and processed through the CVEP PayPal account when our Ebay account is approved.
- 4. CVEP and CA Forward have signed an agreement to merge the California Summit that will be held at the Renaissance Hotel in Indian Wells from October 11-13, 2023, with the CVEP Economic Summit. The terms are favorable for CVEP to mitigate the uncertainties in costs for the associated event. CA Forward expects the attendance to be 800 people.
- 5. CVEP's Fast Pitch qualifier for the Riverside County Innovation Month, Moducan won 3rd place in an event that had a very high quality of contestants. The first and second place winners had already raised over \$1 million each in equity investments.
- 6. A dialog has begun regarding the changes needed to the agreements between the City of Palm Springs and CVEP with respect to the CVEP Headquarters and the Accelerator Campus. The first meeting was held on May 16, 2023, at the City of Palm Springs.
- 7. The Meet the Entrepreneurs event held at the Palm Desert iHub was held on April 24 at 9 am. Among those who attended were Palm Desert's Mayor Kathleen Kelley, Mayor Pro Tem Karina Quintanilla, and Councilmember Evan Trubee. Subsequently, the Palm Desert City Council voted 5 – 0 to enter negotiations with CVEP to operate the Palm Desert iHub with an extension of the existing contract through February of 2026 that coincides with the end of the lease on the facility.

Balance Sheet Changes Post June 30, 2022

- Total Net Assets decreased to (\$3,234) from \$73,657

Mid-Year Budget Analysis: CVEP has reached the 10 month point in FY 22-23 with a positive revenue less expenses of \$17,638. This is above our amended budget of (\$2,743) by \$20,381. The contributors to lower performance relative to last fiscal year are deferring the sale of abandoned assets, lower Summit revenue, some reduced investments and increased expenses driven by inflation across all expense sectors. It is to be noted that the category of salaries and wages is under budget, so talent costs are not contributing to the deviation from the budgeted financial performance. CVEP currently has a strong cash position with 4.6 months of expenses on deposit. Additionally, the expected revenue through April 2023 should maintain a positive performance through that time. A detail of the expectations for the remainder of the fiscal year is below. It is vital to end the year with positive performance to liquidate existing assets and maintain a frugal operating discipline. It is also noted that since FY 20-21 CVEP has absorbed roughly \$400,000 in reduced funding and lost rental opportunities in our facilities.

Best Opportunity to Mitigate Risks: On February 17, 2023, all of the abandoned assets can now be sold, and the liquidation value has the potential to be nearly \$100,000. We are moving on this now. The first deal to sell off surplus equipment has been made but has not closed.

CVEP will be receiving some deferred income in the Spring that will strengthen our already strong cash position. We typically take in about \$85,000 so our end of fiscal year cash and AR should be in the \$350,000 range. July typically is the best cash flow month of the year.

Focusing on FY 23-24 revenue sources and selling available assets should be front of mind alongside our mission of mentoring entrepreneurs and supporting local businesses.



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
