CEO REPORT JUNE 21, 2023

Operational Highlights June 2023

- 1. IEGO was advised by CVEP that we would not be responding to their RFA after consulting with the Executive Committee. Zero responses were submitted from the Coachella Valley so they reached out to us about reconsidering. Our analysis of the work plan was that it would cost between \$280,000 and \$320,000 and require CVEP to hire a dedicated employee. The compensation offered was \$100,000 so I had to explain that we are in no position to take on a task that would lose roughly \$200,000. Stay tuned.
- 2. CVEP advised two developers of large projects at the request of CV Strategies. One is a large energy project and the other is a 1,000-door residential housing project in Indio.
- 3. CVEP met with representatives of Cathedral City and learned that we are included in their budget for the next two years with an increase in support opportunity available in the second year.
- 4. CVEP secured agreements with the City of Palm Desert for 3 years of general support and 44 months for the Palm Desert iHub. Contracts are signed.
- 5. CVEP met with the City of Desert Hot Springs (two members of city council and one staffer). We were told we were in the two-year budget. We were called two weeks later and advised that a shortfall in cannabis taxes created a need to cut some expenses and that we had been cut.
- 6. CVEP attended the Imperial Valley Energy and Economic Summit and learned what is going on with respect to Lithium Valley initiatives and other large Energy Projects. It was a full day and a possible model for CVEP to follow in future Summits.
- 7. The relationship with CA Forward leading up to the California Economic Summit is progressing very well with both sponsorships and coordinated marketing.
- 8. CVEP served as the speaker at a meeting of the Black Chamber of Commerce of Southern California. CVEP was interviewed by Palm Springs Life and KESQ about what is going on with respect to economic development.

Mid-Year Budget Analysis: CVEP reached the end FY 22-23 with a revenue less expenses of negative \$97,205. This is an improvement of \$51,484 from the amended budget that was implemented in January 2023. It is to be noted that the category of salaries and wages for the fiscal year was \$37,621 under budget, so talent costs are not contributing to the deviation from the budgeted financial performance. CVEP currently has a strong cash position with 6.3 months of expenses on deposit or invoiced. It is also noted that since FY 20-21 CVEP has absorbed roughly \$400,000 in reduced funding and lost rental opportunities in our facilities.

Outlook for FY 23-24

Commitments for the fiscal year are not completed with sufficient detail to propose a full budget for approval. We expect to get to the point of submitting a final budget in late September. The delay is substantially due to August being dark for an important City Council approval of new contracts. The contracts are expected to extend for three years.

New investments and increased investments currently add up to \$39,500, while the reduction in investment amounts to \$10,000 for a net increase of \$29,500 from known commitments.

CVEP began the fiscal year with \$305,215 on deposit. July typically is the best cash flow month of the year FY 23-24 will be no different. Month to date billings is \$289,750 and the deferred income on the balance sheet of \$80,000 converts to revenue meaning July's revenue will be \$369,750 plus rent and pass through utilities.

The suggestion of earning some interest by laddering CDs appears to be able to earn CVEP about \$15,000 this fiscal year. Once the July billings start coming in will be launch time.

Focusing on FY 23-24 revenue sources and selling available assets should be front of mind alongside our mission of mentoring entrepreneurs and supporting local businesses.




